From the desk of the Director of Religious Education

Dear Parents,

The Department of Religious Education assists the Church in proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom of God. Our mission is to put adults, children, and youth in communion and intimacy with Jesus Christ, by educating, evangelizing, and empowering them for life and for heaven. With God's grace, catechesis develops initial faith, nourishes de Christian life, and continually unfolds the mystery of Christ until the believer willingly becomes Jesus' disciple.

In class, children are taught to know, love, and serve God by going to Mass, reading the Bible, reading about the lives of the Saints, knowing their prayers and how to pray for themselves and others, to become altar servers, to help others in need, among many other practices. It is not enough to bring your child to one hour of catechesis. It is not enough to bring your child for two years to only receive a Sacrament one time. It is not enough to come to church whenever we fell like it. Leaning more about our King takes a lot of time, and we should want to put extra effort into getting to know Him. Going to Mass should be at the top of our list of things to do. The first precept of the Church is ***"You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest form servile labor."*** This is the way in which Christians fulfill the Third Commandment: ***"Remember, keep holy the Sabbath day."*** We participate in the Mass and refrain from any unnecessary work that distracts us from proper celebration of Christ's Resurrection. As a parent, you owe it to your child to fulfill this precept of the Church. Going to Mass on Sundays to visit the King of Kings should be a great time of joy for the entire family.
